THE EUROPEAN UNION AND RUSSIA: WHAT DOES THE FUTURE HOLD?

In wake of the military conflict in Georgia, European leaders froze talks on the new EU-Russia cooperation agreement and called for a full-scale audit of the EU's relationship with Russia. Difficult questions about the future of EU-Russian relations abound. Does 8.8.8 represent the beginning of a new paradigm in European security? What are the lessons of the Russian-Georgian conflict for the EU? Are shared values a necessary precondition for a strategic partnership between the EU and Russia? Are dialogue and interdependency aims in themselves? Will attempts to promote democracy in the post-Soviet space inevitably produce strategic competition in the EU-Russia shared neighbourhood? Is there a genuine danger of a 'new Cold War'? How might the outcome of the US presidential elections affect the relationship between Russia and the West? How has the financial crisis influenced the relationship between Russia and the West?

These key questions will be addressed at the XIII Open Society Forum organised by the Open Estonia Foundation in cooperation with the European Council on Foreign Relations.
